

Feather and Fan Scarf by Sarah Millington

You will need;

- 200g of wool
- Appropriate knitting needles
- A tapestry needle

You can use any wool you like to make this scarf, just use a needle a size larger than you usually would for the wool to create a lacy effect. For example, if you use double knitting wool then use a 5mm needle and if you use aran wool use a 6mm needle.

Method

Cast on 40 stitches.

Knit two rows as your edging.

Row 1 - Knit

Row 2 - Purl

Row 3 - Knit 2, K2tog 3 times, (yo, K1) 6 times, K2tog 6 times, (yo, K1) 6 times, K2 tog 3 times, Knit 2.

Row 4 - Knit

Rows 1 to 4 form the pattern rows; repeat them until your scarf is the desired length.

To finish, knit two rows then cast off and sew in ends.



Abbreviations

K2tog = knit two stitches together

Yo K1 = yarn over (bringing the yarn to the front of your knitting between the needles then knitting the next stitch as normal)

If you want a wider scarf, you can cast on 76 and use the following pattern row;

Row 3; Knit 2, K2tog 3 times, (yo K1) 6 times, K2tog 6 times, (yo K1) 6 times, K2tog 6 times, (yo K1) 6 times, K2tog 6 times, (yo K1) 6 times, K2tog 3 times, Knit 2.

If you want a narrower scarf, you can cast on 22 stitches use the following pattern row;

Row 3; Knit 2, K2tog 3 times, (yo K1) 6 times, K2tog 3 times, Knit 2.
